



For safe boating, use NOAA nautical charts 25641 and 25647. These charts show navigational aids, such as markers and buoys, and hazardous areas in detail. Do not use this map for navigation.

NO-ANCHOR ZONE
Anchoring is not permitted anywhere within the park along the south side of St. John (except for dinghies under 16 feet). Moorings must be used instead. Anchoring is also prohibited in Virgin Islands Coral Reef National Monument.
